Projects granted will be widely promoted to the Massart and COF communities to recognize the importance of art and design in understanding, imagining, and designing a more sustainable world.

Public presentations will offer opportunities for the Massart community to learn more about how to live and create sustainably.

Project Microgrant

3 awards available

each award \$500 in the form of expense reimbursement*

Application Deadline: October 21, 2016

Award announcement: November 4, 2016

Project completion: April 29, 2017

* *Expense reimbursement* means that you will need to buy the materials you need, then provide the chair of the SIC with receipts for your expenses. The College will then reimburse you for the money you spent.

Grant expectations:

If you are awarded a grant, you will be responsible for keeping us informed of your work.

The student or team grantees must fulfill the following obligations:

- Submit a 1 page project statement (in .docx form) by November 20, 2016
- Submit 3-5 images and any other documentation of the final project (attach examples) by November 20, 2016
- Write 3 blog posts on the Massart Sustainability website (project proposal (by November 20, 2016), midpoint review and final project summary
- Present the work to the Massart community in a brief artist talk format in late April 2016. Grantees are highly encouraged to organize an exhibition that includes their work.

More information about these grant expectations will be given to grantees by a designated faculty or staff mentor.

Eligibility: currently registered undergraduate, graduate, and certificate Massart students

Projects need to be created on and for the Massart campus community.

Proposal review will be by the Sustainability Committee.

Proposal review will be based upon the following criteria:

- Feasibility to accomplish project in given time frame
- Impact on Massart community
- Recommendation from faculty member/staff
- Clarity and detail of project outlined in proposal (depth/thoroughness)
- Innovation/ Creativity
- Use of materials in a sustainable manner
