So what's the deal with

COMPOSTING?

Composting shouldn't be a scary thing only 1 or 2 people you know bother to do. It has so many benefits to both you and the environment!

Step 1

Get or make your own compost bin



Step 2

Fill your bin with dry foliage such as leaves and twigs



Also fill the bin with compostable foods such as fruit peels and eggshells. **NO MEAT or COOKED FOODS!**

Step 3

Alternate between layers of dry foliage and food waste for the best possible fertilization



Step 4

Maintain your Bin!

Habitually add water or dry materials to and mix your compost. It should be just damp and even.



Step 5

Get happy, healthy soil!

Finished compost should look like natural soil. Sprinkle it into your soil and watch your garden prosper!

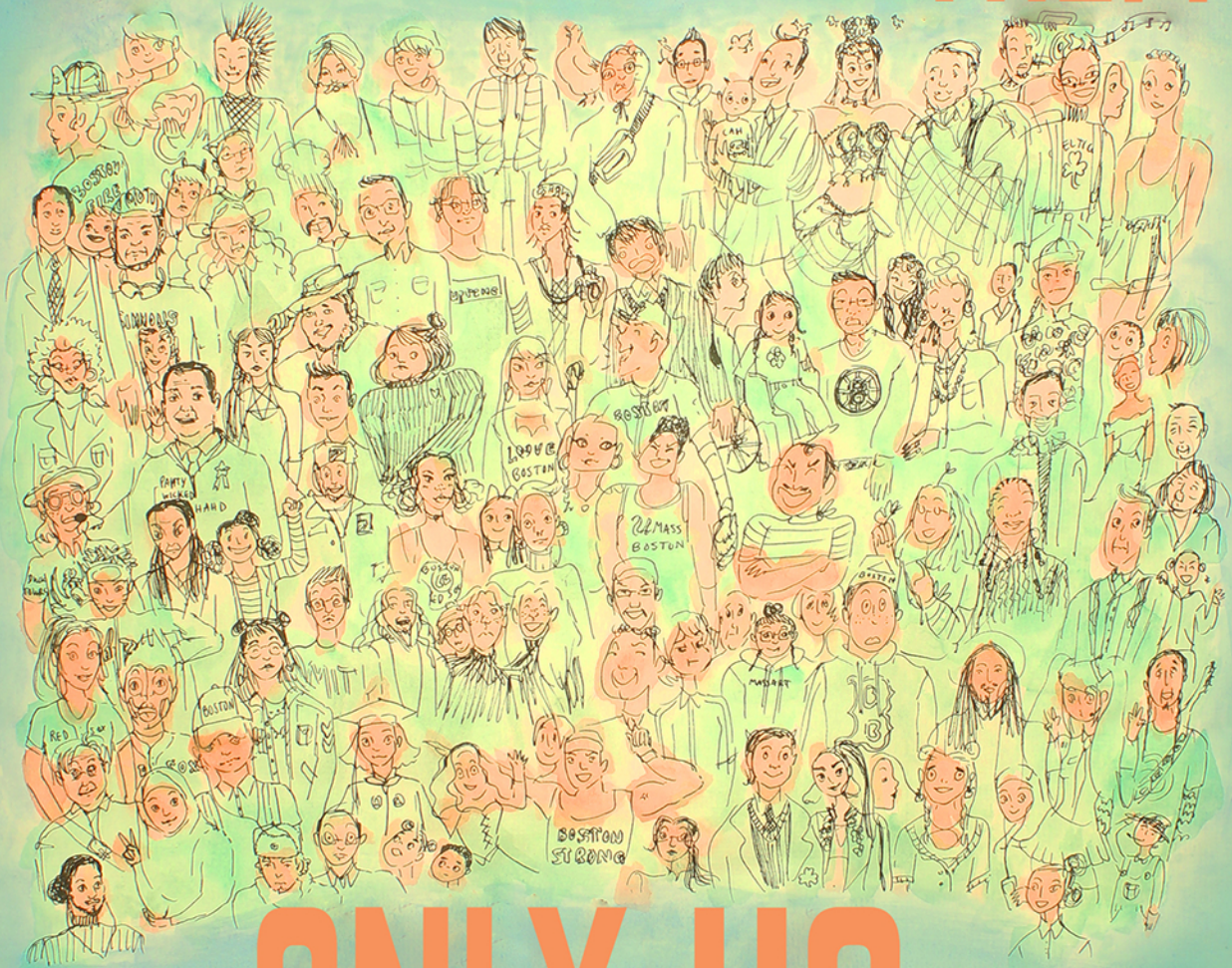

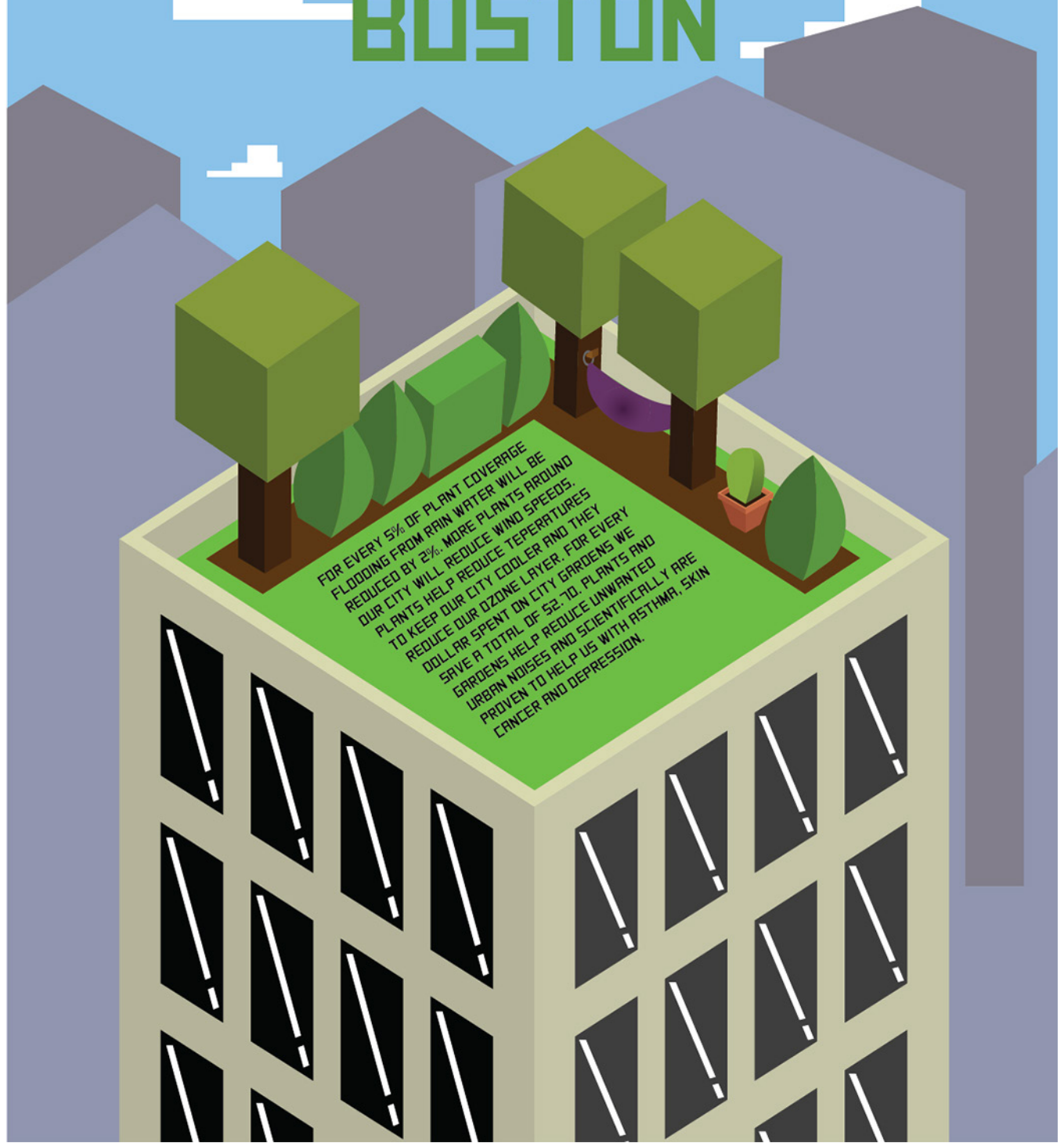

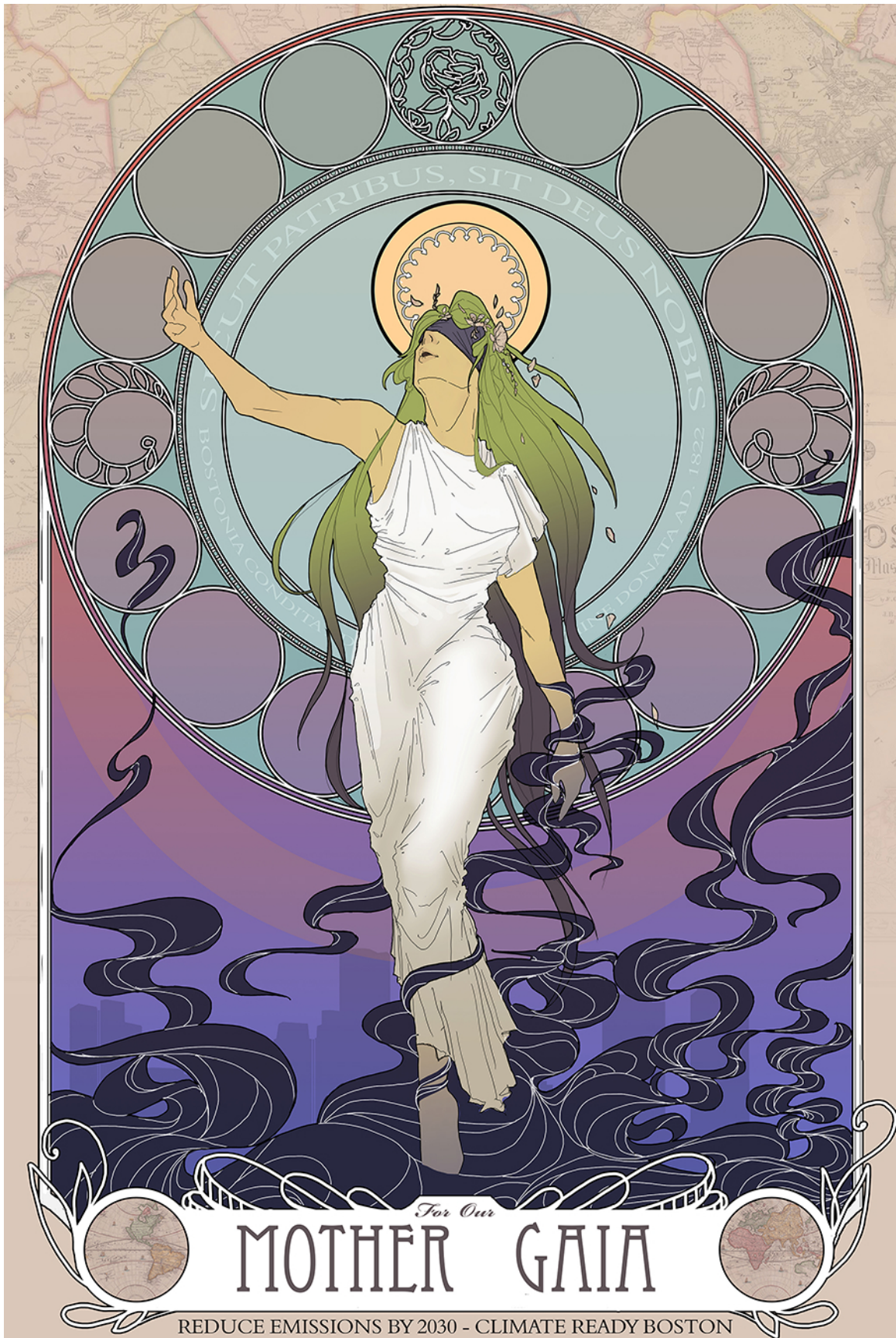
